INTERFAITH CONFERENCE OF GREATER MILWAUKEE MARCH LUNCHEON/LECTURE SERIES

"Where do we go from here?" March 11, 18, and 25 + 11:45 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. First Unitarian Society + 1342 N. Astor Street

Each year, the Peace and International Issues Committee of the Interfaith Conference of Greater Milwaukee sponsors a lecture series in March. This year's theme "Where do we go from here?" will examine what's at stake in the upcoming Wisconsin Supreme Court election, the challenges faced by refugees and immigrants, how people of faith might respond to climate change, and the current challenges in public education.

CONFESSING THE FAITH IN UNSTEADY TIMES An Exploration of the Theological Declaration of Barmen and the Confession of Belhar Sundays, March 23 and 30 + 11:15 in the Upper Room

Throughout the history of the Christian movement churches have written confessions of faith (a public declarations of what a church believes) when they have sensed an urgent and emerging need to share their convictions in response to changing cultural landscapes. Two of these confessions will be explored in an upcoming adult education series. On March 23, Rev. Dr. John Helt and Rev. John Dillon will lead an exploration of the Theological Declaration of Barmen, written in 1934 in response to the rise of Nazism in Germany. On March 30, Dr. Bush will discuss the Confession of Belhar, written in 1986 in response to apartheid in South Africa. Copies of each confession are on the tables in the Great Hall. Reading the confessions beforehand is not required to participate in the series.

In Memoriam

John Radtke died on February 23 in Sun City, Arizona. He was an active member of Immanuel with his wife Susan Radtke from 1999 to 2015. Susan and John were married at Immanuel Church during morning worship on July 9, 2000.

Clair Baum died on March 2 at his home at St. John's on the Lake. Clair had been an active participant in the life of the congregation since his wife Mary joined in 2009. A memorial service in the Immanuel Sanctuary is being planned for later this spring.

Our prayers and sympathies are with the Radtke and Baum families.


