PRESBYTERIAN DISASTER ASSISTANCE Responding to Hurricane Helene Donations for cleanup buckets needed!

In the aftermath of Hurricane Helene, Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) has deployed (or will soon deploy) response teams in Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, and Georgia. Six initial presbytery assistance grants and two church damage grants have also been provided. This setting expands and enhances the thematic inclusiveness of an early 20th-century text by adapting the melody of a traditional spiritual to carry these words. This 1940 pairing marked the first use of African American musical material in a mainline North American hymnal.



Guitar chords do not correspond with keyboard harmony.

This text affirms that Christian unity is not achievement but gift, one renewed each time we gather for the Lord's Supper. Each of us enters as an "I" and leaves as part of "we." The unadorned language of this text is well matched to the simple shape note tune that sets it here.

The first two stanzas of this hymn were written between the 20th century's two world wars and focus on the theme of international peace. The third stanza, by another author and added later, uses the language of the Lord's Prayer to voice a distinctly Christian perspective.
