GUIDELINES FOR IN-PERSON WORSHIP

Register in advance each week: Registration for each Sunday worship service opens on the preceding Monday. Please register as early in the week as possible. It is easy to update your registration later, if needed. Click the following link for a step by step guide through the registration process: https://bit.ly/3qIK0nV

The capacity for socially distanced seating in the Sanctuary is 130 persons. Pews are designated with places for 1-4 persons; ushers will assist worshipers with finding a seat.

If registrations exceed 130, persons can sign up on a waiting list and will be contacted by phone or text by Saturday at 5:00 p.m.

Worshipers must arrive by 9:45 to check in (Great Hall) and then be seated by an usher. Please be patient as we accommodate this process. Bulletins are provided on the Narthex tables ("low touch").

In the spirit of loving our neighbor as ourselves, vaccinations for those who are eligible are strongly encouraged for gathering in the Sanctuary. Worship leaders and volunteers, including the Welcome Team and ushers, have verified their full vaccination status with the church office.

Masks must be worn inside at all times and will be provided, if necessary. Hand sanitizer will be readily available.

As weather allows, doors at the front and back of the Sanctuary will be opened to facilitate air flow. There are no windows that can be opened in the Sanctuary.

Worshipers will be dismissed by the ushers at the end of the service, during the postlude, to maintain social distancing.

For the time being, there will be no Coffee Hour in the Parlor.

Building access is limited to the Sanctuary, the Great Hall, and the rest rooms adjacent to the first floor coatroom. Access is available to the Columbarium on the lower level via the elevator.

Nursery care will resume at a later time. Parents may use the Parlor, instead of the Crying Room, as needed.

Please practice "touchless greeting" if you converse outdoors before or after the service. Greet one another with a hand over your heart or an elbow bump rather than a handshake or hug, respecting the boundaries of social spacing and personal comfort levels.

If you feel sick on Sunday morning, please stay home. If you believe you have been exposed to COVID-19 or test positive within two weeks of attending worship, please contact the church office ASAP.
